Twinning Agreements

Twin Cities are cities in different countries of the world, which have established direct friendship agreements between them to strengthen economic and cultural relations between peoples, to initiate and mutually benefit of the exchange of experience in order to prosper the lives of communities. This cooperation and friendship play an important role in the development of each city and is expressed through the exchange of official delegations, artistic and sports groups, the organization of exhibitions of various kinds, book donations, movie presentations, etc.

60 years ago, the World Federation of Twin Cities was established in Aix-les-Bains (France). The organization is headquartered in Paris. World Twin Cities Day is celebrated annually since 1963 on the last Sunday in April.

Since 1977 and until now, the Chisinau City Hall and the five districts of the city, have established friendly relations and cooperation with 51 cities in 21 countries of the world. The first city that Chisinau twinned was the city of Grenoble, France (January 25, 1977). The signing of twinning agreements and cooperation protocols is the basis for important projects related to strengthening the socio-economic objectives of the municipality and promoting the common values of twinned cities.

On October 14, 2019 on Vlaicu Parcalab str., near the Chisinau City Hall's office, was inaugurated an informative bronze pillar with the names of the cities twinned with the city of Chisinau.
